

Courthouse USA, LLC ValueArmor Application Privacy Policy

- 1.** Data provided by a local jurisdiction and which serves as the source data needed to run the ValueArmor Application comes from the public record and by definition is open record data. The data itself and utilizing the application results in data covered by this Privacy Policy. We are committed to safeguarding the privacy of our ValueArmor Application users; in this policy we explain how we will treat data. We'll start by getting a few definitions out of the way that should help you understand this policy. When we say "we," "us," "Courthouse USA, LLC" or "CUSA" we're referring to Courthouse USA, LLC, a Missouri limited liability company. When we say "you" we're referring to the entity that's registered with us to use the ValueArmor Application "the VA App".
- 2.** If there are any changes to this Privacy Policy, we'll post them on the Website.
- 3.** When you register to use the VA App you are giving us information needed to run the VA App, or authorizing us to acquire the data needed to run the VA App. In using the VA App, data is created and stored. It follows, in using the VA App you consent to the data being generated and stored and made available only to you via a secure URL, and only as described in this Privacy Policy.
- 4.** Occasionally, we have to disclose information about our customers to meet legal requirements. Third party disputes are a common example. If two parties have a dispute, then we might get a request for user data. Whether we comply or not depends on the subpoena.
- 5.** Nobody is safe from hackers. If a security breach causes an unauthorized intrusion into our system that materially affects you we will notify you as soon as possible and later report the action we took in response.
- 6.** We do our best to keep the data serving as source for the VA App up to date, but we are not liable if that data is not accurate or up to date.
